TEACHING AND LEARNING

HUME ANGLICAN GRAMMAR IS A PROGRESSIVE, CO-EDUCATIONAL PREP TO YEAR 12 SCHOOL. WE ARE PROACTIVE IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF EXCELLENT BUILDINGS, FACILITIES AND GROUNDS AND OUR APPROACH TO TEACHING AND LEARNING IS BOTH INNOVATIVE AND ADVANCED. OUR STUDENTS ARE CHALLENGED TO TAKE RISKS, BE COLLABORATIVE AND BECOME TEAM-ORIENTED.



Digital literacy and competence in the use of various technologies enhances a strong grounding in literacy and numeracy. A team of expert teachers is dedicated to building strong relationships with each student while encouraging them to develop the essential components of learning. Two Heads of Curriculum and five Heads of Learning in both the Primary and Secondary levels have responsibility for leading their teams. The focus is on continuous improvement and implementing the latest educational developments.

Our student cohort readily displays warmth, humour and respect for one another and their teachers, a testament to our teaching styles and programs. We deliver a holistic, high-quality education driven by professional and dedicated staff.

At Hume, we offer a broad, values-centred and Australian Curriculum Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA) compliant curriculum. We are structured into two schools, Primary and Secondary, to deliver our academic program in a caring and nurturing environment.

Each school caters for the individual needs of the student and implements practices appropriate for that developmental stage. Most importantly, one of the great benefits of a Prep to Year 12 school is the smooth transition we can provide from the Primary to Secondary levels. An additional class is added at Year 7 as there are a number of new students commencing in Secondary School. These junior secondary years are vibrant, challenging and appropriate for adolescents.

Students are offered an environment where they can achieve academic excellence and personal growth. As an Anglican School we are bound by strong values and have high expectations of our staff and students.

Each student is cherished for their own individual strengths so they may be nurtured to prosper and flourish. At the heart of our purpose at Hume Anglican Grammar is a commitment to develop life-long learners. Every student is encouraged and supported to discover and fulfil their unique potential – whether it is academic, sporting or artistic.





TECHNOLOGY AND e-LEARNING

We use the most up-to-date technology within the School to give our students the best access and enhance their learning capacity. The use of Interactive Whiteboard technology, upgraded WI-FI, computers, scanners, iPads, digital cameras and wireless internet access is incorporated into the curriculum. Computers are located in all areas for presenting work and communicating and accessing information.

Our Primary School students also have access to iPads for use within classrooms to broaden their learning experience through a range of activities and use of Apps.

The Secondary School students have access to the Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) program. The BYOD program features a Virtual Desktop Infrastructure (VDI) that is managed by the School. The VDI is a desktop deployment model that streamlines new user setup, simplifies BYOD operation and provides greater flexibility for network connected devices.

As an eSmart school, we deliberately target opportunities both within the curriculum and wellbeing programs across the school that teach the children about being safe and responsible digital citizens.

At Hume Anglican Grammar we are proactive in our curriculum and ICT planning and work collaboratively with our parents to give our students the skills to use these resources responsibly and safely.

PRIMARY

WITHIN THE PRIMARY SCHOOL WE HAVE DEVELOPED AN INTEGRATED AND MULTI-FACETED UNDERSTANDING OF THINKING AND LEARNING. IT IS A DYNAMIC UNDERSTANDING THAT WE ARE CONSTANTLY RE-VISITING TO ENSURE IT MEETS THE CHANGING NEEDS OF OUR INDIVIDUAL STUDENTS.

We offer a balanced approach to learning, a compassionate consideration of the emotional wellbeing of students, and the opportunity for all young people to flourish within our innovative and caring environment.

Teaching our students to become responsible citizens in a global society is an integral part of our academic curriculum.

A diverse curriculum

Our broad-based curriculum includes English, Mathematics, Science, Humanities, Visual Arts, Performing Arts (music, dance, drama), Health, Physical Education, Italian (LOTE), Information and Communication Technology (ICT) and Religious and Values Education (RAVE).



We employ well-researched and effective teaching and learning programs and tools to give our students access to a wide variety of learning activities. At Hume, we integrate the use of technology in a natural and exciting way for our students. Students use a range of technologies such as laptop computers, iPads and Interactive Whiteboards as part of their learning and our staff are constantly training in the latest teaching methods and techniques.

Learning strategies

We strive to create learning environments that:

- Build and reinforce a sense of identity and cultural awareness.
- Foster recognition and development of universal human values.
- Stimulate curiosity, ingenuity and inquiry in order to foster a spirit of discovery and enjoyment of learning.
- Equip students with the basic skills to learn and acquire knowledge, individually or collaboratively, and to apply these skills and knowledge accordingly across a broad range of areas.
- Provide awareness of International perspectives while responding to Australian contexts and interests.
- Ensure flexibility and responsiveness of teaching and learning approaches to the different needs of our diverse student population.

- Assist students to develop the autonomy needed for full and efficient participation in their own learning.
- Provide appropriate forms of assessment to facilitate effective learning and to ensure that students work to their potential and achieve their personal best.



SECONDARY

HUME ANGLICAN GRAMMAR IS COMMITTED TO PROVIDING A 21ST CENTURY EDUCATION THAT IS NOT LIMITED TO ACADEMIC PURSUIT BUT ALSO RECOGNISES THAT THE WELLBEING OF EVERY STUDENT IS PARAMOUNT IF THEY ARE TO REALISE THEIR FULL POTENTIAL.

Within the Secondary School, students are encouraged to aim high in all they do and be proud of their achievements. The overarching focus is on teaching students to have enquiring minds and take responsibility for their learning in order to help them achieve long-term success.

We recognise that we are living in a fast-paced, globally connected world and we aim to give our students the skills they need to work effectively in their senior years of schooling. We provide the foundation for their future success. Our Secondary curriculum incorporates a comprehensive range of subjects designed to help students identify and successfully pursue their career goals. It is continually reviewed to allow for new initiatives that respond to our student interests and growing cohort.



Years 7 and 8

In Years 7 and 8 the curriculum is largely based on the key learning areas of English, Mathematics, Science, Humanities, Italian (LOTE), Health and Physical Education and Religious and Values Education (RAVE). Students also experience Visual and Performing Arts, Information and Communication Technology (ICT), and Design and Technology Studies.

Years 9 and 10

In Year 9 and 10 the core curriculum is narrowed and students begin to make elective choices, providing them with a foundation of experience, knowledge, understanding and skills in an even broader range of subjects. These include Forensic Science, Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics (STEM), Media Studies, Outdoor Education and many more. This enables students to make informed choices about courses in Years 11 and 12.

Years 11 and 12

Within the senior Secondary years, the curriculum offers a broad range of Unit 1–4 subjects which allows students to work towards completing the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE). We are responsive to student interests and will continue to grow our VCE subject offerings as numbers in the Senior Secondary School continue to increase.







CREATING LEADERS

THERE ARE A RANGE OF **OPPORTUNITIES FOR STUDENTS** TO DEVELOP LEADERSHIP SKILLS AND SERVE THE SCHOOL COMMUNITY. AT EACH YEAR LEVEL STUDENTS CAN REPRESENT THEIR CLASS MATES AS SENATORS. PROVIDING THEM WITH A VOICE SO THEIR INTERESTS AND ISSUES CAN BE HEARD.

Service model leadership is the focus for Hume Anglican Grammar students. Our students accept leadership roles so that they may set an example. We encourage them to pursue opportunities and challenges, reach out to others, embrace the role and become leaders.

In Primary School, students nominate Captains from the Year 6 cohort to represent them. They lead the Senators in the Primary Senate where students develop skills in public speaking and diplomacy.

In Secondary School students are able to nominate to lead The Social Justice and Community Service Committee or The Environment and Sustainability Committee. The Arts department also elect a leader who helps organise and promote The Arts within the school community. Finally, there is the opportunity to nominate for School Captain in Year 12.

Our House System

We have a House system in both Primary and Secondary where students are elected to the positions of House Captain and House Vice Captain for each House. These students lead their House at three major sporting carnivals (Swimming, Athletics and Cross Country) and during the year they are involved in the organisation of a range of House activities. We are committed to encouraging all students, regardless of their ability, with the opportunity to participate in sport throughout their academic journey.

Some of the sports our students participate include AFL, Basketball, Cricket, Hot Shots Tennis, Netball, Soccer, Softball, Volleyball and the Alternative Sport Program.

Inter-House Sport

Upon enrolment, all Hume Anglican Grammar students are allocated to a House, which they remain in throughout their journey at the school.

Annual Inter-House competitions take place throughout the year in swimming, athletics and cross country.

These events are open to students of all abilities and through our Physical Education (PE) staff, they are strongly encouraged to participate and have fun in a safe and inclusive environment.

SSV Inter-School Sport

Hume Anglican Grammar is a member of School Sport Victoria in the Northern Metropolitan Region, Mickleham Division.

At both the Primary and Secondary level students have the opportunity as a result of the Carnival Days and our Inter-House events to progress to SSV District and Regional events and even State Finals.

Successful teams at the conclusion of each term play in a finals series, which occurs at the commencement of the following term.



THE ARTS

THE ARTS INCLUDES DANCE, DRAMA, MEDIA ARTS, MUSIC, VISUAL ARTS AND VISUAL COMMUNICATION DESIGN.

Our Arts programs enable students to develop their creative and expressive capacities by learning about the different practices, disciplines and traditions that have shaped the expression of culture locally, nationally and globally. Students are both artist and audience in The Arts. They make, respond and learn to appreciate the specific ways this occurs in different disciplines.

Our students study all Arts subjects in Year 7 and 8. In Years 9 and 10 they choose from a range of Arts electives of their choice. Hume offers VCE pathways in Dance, Drama, Media, Music, Studio Arts and Visual Communication Design.

Students have a range of display and performance opportunities across the year including Arts Week, Interstate Arts Tours, Battle of the Bands, Dance Troupe, Theatre Sports and Visual Arts Competitions.



PERFORMING ARTS

OUR PURPOSE-BUILT PERFORMING ARTS CENTRE IS THE HOME OF DANCE, DRAMA, MUSIC, DIGITAL MUSIC PRODUCTION AND A GROWING INSTRUMENTAL PROGRAM. IN THIS FACILITY, STUDENTS FROM PREP TO YEAR 12 CAN BE SEEN LEARNING NEW SKILLS AND REHEARSING FOR A VARIETY OF PERFORMANCES.

Some of these include regular concerts, showcases and the opportunity for secondary students to participate in one of the many bands. A major production also occurs in the Primary and Secondary school in alternate years. It is always very popular and a wonderful way to showcase talent and hard work.



BEYOND THE CLASSROOM

HUME ANGLICAN GRAMMAR CREATES LEADERS FOR THE FUTURE, SHAPED WITHIN A VIBRANT, HAPPY AND INNOVATIVE LEARNING ENVIRONMENT. EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES ARE AN INTEGRAL COMPONENT OF A STUDENT'S OVERALL EDUCATION.

We believe that such activities, wisely selected, will contribute to your child's attainment of successful educational outcomes. These activities will foster specific skills, team collaboration, leadership and values that become part of their lives now and in the future.

We offer a range of extra-curricular sporting opportunities. Our Year 5 and 6 students participate in inter-school fixtures against local Primary schools during the first semester in football, soccer, volleyball, cricket and softball. Football, soccer and cricket are offered to our Year 7–12 students. They participate in a local School Sport Victoria competition. In addition, all students in the Upper Primary and throughout the Secondary school are able to participate in our own carnivals in order to be selected to represent Hume in district, regional and event State level swimming, athletics and cross country events. Outside of the sporting arena our students participate in inter-school debating, chess and theatre sports events, within the Galway Schools' Competition.

Without doubt one of the strongest non-sporting extra-curricular areas on offer is within the Performing Arts. Each year a major production is held, with the Primary and Secondary schools alternating, while regular music soirees and performances allow our musicians, dancers and actors to showcase their talents.

OUR CAMPUSES

ALTHOUGH ESTABLISHED IN 2008, IT WASN'T UNTIL 2011 THAT HUME ANGLICAN GRAMMAR MOVED TO ITS CURRENT LOCATION AT THE MICKLEHAM CAMPUS. TODAY THE SCHOOL OCCUPIES A PICTURESQUE 10-HECTARE SITE ON MT RIDLEY SURROUNDED BY NEW ARCHITECTURE AND HERITAGE BUILDINGS SUCH AS THE HOMESTEAD AND COACH HOUSE WHICH WERE BUILT DURING THE 1850S.

We are growing and each year the School has a number of capital developments underway. As we flourish, we continue to introduce more facilities on the school grounds, in the teaching space and to support our specialist programs.

Our more recent additions to the Mickleham Campus include the purpose built Performing Arts Centre, Cricket and Soccer pitches, a Science lab and new classrooms in the Primary area especially for the Year 5 and 6s.

In 2019 we will open an additional campus in Donnybrook and will continue to educate young people and work towards delivering a holistic, values-based, high-quality education driven by professional and dedicated staff, at an accessible cost to our community.



SCHOLARSHIPS

HUME ANGLICAN GRAMMAR OFFERS A NUMBER OF ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIPS EVERY YEAR.

Scholarships are a partial remission of fees for students entering Year 7 or Year 10 and are in place for the remaining years of their schooling at Hume.

Entrance is open to all new and existing students of Hume Anglican Grammar. We hope it will make possible for someone of exceptional ability to attend our school when the financial circumstances of the family would otherwise make it difficult. This initiative will provide an opportunity for many to achieve and pursue academic excellence.
